Hospitalization.

If you are hospitalized upon admission, be sure to indicate that you are a Catholic and give permission to have your name included on the hospital’s religious census to ensure that you receive the spiritual/sacramental care afforded to Catholics during your hospitalization. Because new federal confidentiality regulations (HIPPA Patient Privacy Law) only patients who give their permission will receive pastoral care. Otherwise, priests or pastoral visitors will not have access to your name, and will be prevented from visiting you in the hospital.

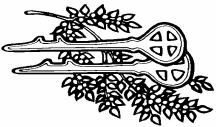
