THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

In the next few weeks we will discuss the commandments.

The great commandment of love requires of us that we act towards God as his sons and daughters and that we act towards other people as children of the same Father, members of the Body of Christ. While these two commandments are broad and can be implemented in various ways, God also gave us the Ten Commandments where we find our minimal duties towards God and neighbor set forth in clear terms.

If we love God we will keep the first three commandments: they tell us our duties towards God. If we love ourselves and our neighbor we will keep the other seven commandments; they tell us our duties towards ourselves and our neighbor.

The Ten Commandments are not laws which were enacted to establish order or to test our obedience. They flow from our very nature as human beings. Because we were created by God and depend on him completely we must, as intelligent, responsible beings, acknowledge that dependence. We must praise God, love him, believe him, and show reverence for his name. Because all of us human beings have certain rights that we receive from God, we must respect those rights in others.

In studying the Ten Commandments, therefore, we are studying the laws which tell us how we must act because we are human beings—how we must act towards God and how we must act towards other people. But, more than that, in studying the Ten Commandments we are studying the laws which help us fulfill the great law of love.
