This week's second collection will be for the **Missions**. Bishop Capistrano F. Heim, OFM of Brazil will be speaking for the Holy Name Province of the Friars (the group at St. Anthony's at Arch Street, Boston) who have a Mission in Brazil. He has served in Brazil for the past 45 years; the last 20 years as a Bishop in the Amazon Rain Forest. There are no diocesan priests- only Missionary priests of Orders and Congregations. They have only 14 priests for the whole area about the size of New England plus the state of New York. Most of the people are poor immigrants looking for an opportunity to farm in the hot humid conditions with no paved roads.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS
