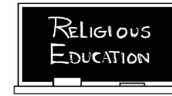

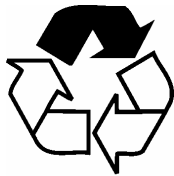
Attention Eucharistic Ministers

Keys for Hope

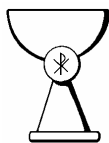

The Seven Sacraments Life from Christ A Catholic Catechism for adults.

This week we will cover the first sacrament of **Baptism**

Each Baptized Person is called to develop a new life in Christ. In fact a Christian is expected to rise above a mere observance of the moral law. He or she is expected to imitate Jesus in every way.

The name given at Baptism should have some Christian significance. The Church encourages people to name their children after saints. The rationale behind this practice is that the patron saint becomes a model and protector of the child being baptized.

Any practicing Catholic over 16 years of age who has made his or her First Communion and has been confirmed can be a godparent or a sponsor. A non Catholic Christian cannot be a godparent but can act as a Christian witness. Likewise a Catholic cannot be a godparent for a non-Catholic but can act as a Christian witness. Only one godparent is necessary but two, one of each sex, are usual.

A dying infant may be baptized by anyone who pours natural water over the child's head and says, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit". A dying adult must express some desire to be baptized and should believe at least that there is one God in three Persons who rewards good and punishes evil and that Jesus Christ is The Son of God.

Once a Catholic, always a Catholic" is true in the sense that once we are baptized in the Catholic church we can become an active catholic at any time by merely confessing our sins and beginning to practice our faith.
