Our Catholic Religion The Sacrament of Reconciliation from Christ A Catholic Catechism for Adults

We must receive the sacrament of Reconciliation when we are guilty of serious sin because we must become reconciled to God before we may approach the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. It is not necessary to go to confession each time we receive Communion unless we have committed mortal sin.

Catholics are bound under pain of mortal sin to go to confession at least once a year, but only if they are guilty of serious sin.

You should not wait until the time of your next confession to begin the practice of examining your conscience. It is highly recommended that everyone make an examination of conscience every day. Just before retiring at night is a good time to do so. An effort to recall the sins committed for these as well as all past sins will help you advance spiritually.

When using the open confessional or face to face approach, the penitent can receive the sacrament of Reconciliation in a more relaxed manner.

When going to confession, begin with words like these: Bless me Father, for I have sinned. It has been XX number of weeks since my last confession. I am (married, single, widowed.) Next tell your sins. When you have confessed all of your sins, say, "I am sorry for these and all my past sins. The priest might then give some spiritual advice before assigning a penance for you to perform. After the sinner has expressed sorrow by praying the act of contrition, the priest gives absolution. End by saying "Thank you Father" and leave the confessional.

A guide for the Catholic Patient

When you enter a hospital for care please identify yourself as a Catholic, tell them what parish you are from, request to see a Catholic Chaplin, and let them know if you have already received the Sacrament of the Sick. This is necessary because of the privacy act you must notify

Chaplains are Board Certified and are laywomen and men, priests, deacons, religious sisters and brothers trained to minister to the sick. You should ask for a minister when you are feeling anxious, lonely or isolated, when you are concerned about your family, when you desire prayer, when you have questions about your faith, when you are in need of the sacraments, when you want to talk.
