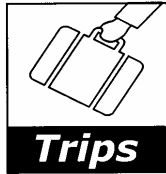

Did you miss some Sacraments along the way? If you're a baptized Catholic who never received Holy Communion or Confirmation we have a program designed to bring you up to speed and get you fully initiated into the Catholic Church. Each Sunday we have covered the seven sacraments. This week we look to *Holy Orders*. Through Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, we are initiated into the church and come to share as disciples in the life and mission of the Church. Through the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Anointing of the Sick, we are healed and strengthened

The Anointing of the Sick

— The Anointing of the Sick along with Reconciliation is one of the two sacraments of healing. The Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament by which Jesus, through the anointing and prayers of a priest, gives health and strength to a person who is seriously ill.

Anyone who is seriously ill due to sickness or old age may receive this sacrament. Prudent judgment is all that is necessary to determine whether the sickness is serious enough to warrant the sacrament. The sick person may not be in danger of death.

Through the Anointing of the Sick, Jesus:

- increases the divine life in an ill person
- sometimes restores health to that person
- gives the graces needed to accept the illness
- forgives sin and removes the temporal punishment due to sin

When confession is impossible, Jesus forgives even mortal sin through this sacrament.

Important information everyone should be aware of:

- Those who have the care of a sick person should call a priest as soon as they discover the illness is serious. The person, fortified by the actual graces of this sacrament, can honestly face life or death, whichever God in his providence has designated.
- When the priest comes to a home or hospital or nursing home on a sick call the members of the family should remain with the sick person, except while the priest is hearing his or her confession.
- Catholics should be careful to let their parish priest know whenever there is any serious illness in the family. The priest can judge what ought to be done.

In the case of prolonged illness, the priest or a minister of care will bring Communion even when there is no danger of death.

- If someone is injured seriously, a priest should be called immediately.
