Lift Catholic Worship for a New Generation

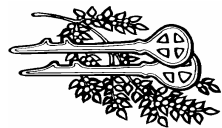

Outlines of the Catholic Faith from the catechism of the Catholic Church

Creation

- A. God is the Creator of all things, heaven and earth, the sea and all is in them.
 1. Minerals, which have no life.
 2. Plants, which have life
 3. Animals, birds, and fish which have bodies, life and the power to move about
 4. Human beings who have bodies, intellects and free wills.
 5. Angels, the highest creatures, are spirits without bodies. Angels have intellects and wills.

B The names of the three angels mentioned in Scripture are Raphael, Gabriel, and Michael.

C The angels were tested by god to accept his will. Some chose to reject God and these angels are the fallen angels. Those who accepted his will are the good angels.

D The good angels are in heaven with God; the fallen angels (Devils) are in Hell.

E The chief of the fallen angels is called Satan.

F Man is a creature composed of body and soul and made in the image and likeness of God.

G The first human beings that God created were Adam and Eve, our first parents. God placed them In the Garden of Eden, sometimes called Paradise.

H Adam and Eve were tempted by Satan to eat the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil in the Garden of Eden. Adam and Eve chose to eat of the fruit of the tree. In so doing, they rejected God. This sin is called Original Sin.

I Because of their disobedience Adam and Eve were driven from the Garden of Eden. They also became subject to suffering, sin and death.

J. By their sin Adam and Eve lost Sanctifying Grace, the greatest gift they had received when they were created.
