*From the Outlines of the Catholic Faith based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church.....*

The Chief Truths taught by Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church are contained in the Apostle's Creed.

**"I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth"**

God is the Supreme Being who is his own existence and is infinitely perfect. God can accomplish all things; in him nothing is impossible.

God made all things from nothing by his own power. He is all knowing and sees all things.

There is only one God and there can never be another.

There are three persons in the one God head, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. (Known as the Blessed Trinity.)

A person who does not believe in God is known as an atheist.

A person who claims that he or she does not know whether God exists or not is an agnostic.

**"I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord."**

**Jesus is true God and true Man.**

Nature is what something is.

Person is who someone is.

Jesus is only one person; the second person of the Blessed Trinity, God the Son is consubstantial with the Father and the Holy Spirit. When God the Son became man, he assumed human nature, uniting it to his divine nature.

There are two natures in Jesus; divine and human. As man, God the Son (Jesus) has a body and a soul as all human beings do.

The mystery of God becoming man is known as the Incarnation.

The name Jesus means savior and the name Christ means anointed.

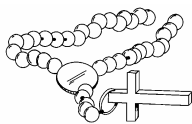
