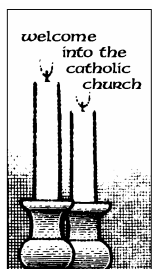
Home Schooling Families

From the Outlines of the Catholic Faith based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church.....

The Chief Truths taught by Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church are contained in the

Apostle's Creed.

“He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again”

Christ truly died. He experienced the separation of soul and body.

His body was laid in a tomb and his soul was glorified. After he had been put in the tomb, Jesus by his own power, raised his body to life again on the third day. (RESURRECTION)

The day Christ rose from the dead is called EASTER SUNDAY.

“He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the father.”

Forty days after EASTER our Savior, body and soul, ascended into heaven.

This day is known as Ascension Thursday (It always fall on a Thursday.)and is a Holy Day of Obligation.

Christ sits at the right hand of the Father in the highest place in heaven.
