You may have noticed at the weekend Masses that the ushers are walking down the aisles with a clicker in their hands. This happens every October, at every church throughout the Archdiocese. The “mass count” is taken at every weekend Mass for the entire month. Each Mass is tallied and the weekend total is logged. The numbers are forwarded to the Archdiocesan Office for Planning. These numbers are looked as regards parish viability, etc. They are part of the factors used in evaluating and planning for the future. This would certainly be an important variable taken into account, especially in towns where there is more than one parish. Our numbers are slightly down from last year. The fact that we no longer have a Saturday 5:30 PM Mass, may, or may not, be the reason for this. However, it is not the number of Masses, but rather, the number of people that attend, that is taken into account.

Bishop John Dooher, the Regional Bishop for the South Region of the Archdiocese was here at St. Peter’s to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation to sixty-four of our young adults who are presently in their junior year of high school. Please pray for them as they have received the last of the Sacraments of Initiation – that they may come to an awareness that this is not the end of religious education and living their commitment of faith as responsible people of faith.
