It is Lent. We are dreaming of Unity by being of service to others through prayer, fasting almsgiving and learning.

Learning how to be grateful can be one of the more difficult things. I know that a parent told me that one of the hardest things to do was to teach his children to be generous. That would be true because to be generous requires a grateful spirit. If we want to be generous, we first of all have to develop that culture and spirit of gratefulness. To me it seems that one of the best ways of doing this would be to start every day by giving thanks for all the people whose lives you will touch and whose lives will touch yours. Follow that with a prayer in which you offer everything you do that day as an act of thanksgiving and love for God and others.

Helping others keep warm and safe this winter has been a great act of love and thanksgiving for the heat we have at our finger tips. In visiting with a person

who has endured quite a few winters of cold, we talked of taking heat for granted. He ended by saying: "For many of those winters, we didn't turn on the heat. We shoveled it on."

Gratefulness in economic times such as ours does require time to look anew at our blessings, at how others have and are touching our lives and how we touch the lives of others often in unsuspecting ways. I spent a week in Phoenix. I heard so much talk and frustration and anger about the economic situation. To one person I said: "I'm going back to North Dakota where I hardly every hear such negativity." Mike Kildorf recently said: "If you always look at the bad, the good will pass you by." Another wisdom saying that has been passed on in our culture is: "The birds always sing after a storm."

When we pay attention to that attitude, then we will always be able to see God acting in our lives and our times. We end up with that beautiful and life-giving attitude of gratefulness.
