### Question of the Week: 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Week of July 11, 2010

Deuteronomy 30: 10-14, Colossians 1: 15-20, Luke 10: 25-37 - "Go and do the same!"

In visiting with the family of Florence, a long-time St. James Basilica parishioner who died recently, I came upon some poetry that she had written. I didn't get to see it all, but I really appreciated this one:

### Saint of the Week: Theresa Benedicta of the Holy Cross, Virgin and Martyr

Born Edith Stein into a Jewish family, she was the youngest of eleven children. Losing her father when she was two years old, Edith developed a strong love for her mother. Her mother kept the family together, with seven surviving children, while continuing to run the family business. Though she admired her mother's strong faith, by the time she was a teenager Edith was an avowed atheist. She became a teacher, and eventually formed an interest in Catholicism. In 1921, Edith picked up the autobiography of Saint Teresa of Ávila

from a friend's library and read it in one sitting. When she set the book down, she declared, "This is truth!" She was baptized on January 1, 1922. When the Nazis came to power in 1933, Edith was dismissed from her teaching position because of her Jewish background. At this time, she did enter the Carmelite convent at Cologne, taking the name, Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. She was eventually taken prisoner by the Nazis and killed. Teresa did not choose martyrdom, but when it was thrust upon her, she did not shrink from it. Her faith in God gave her the strength that she needed.

### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Being a disciple, living out stewardship, cannot be done alone or without guidance. Jesus is your best friend and guide in this venture. You wouldn't go very long without talking to your best friend or spending time together. So it is with Jesus. Build a personal relationship with him through daily prayer and weekly participation in Mass or Divine Liturgy. Choose a time every day for prayer, by yourself or perhaps in front of the Blessed Sacrament. Find the time that seems most sacred for you, and take that time to spend alone with God. Thank him and give him praise. Then ask his blessing on others. Tell him about your day with its joys and struggles; humbly share with him those times you have used your gifts for the good of others; ask his forgiveness when you have failed to do so. Go to confession on a regular basis, drawing upon the graces offered through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If possible, attend the Eucharist more than once a week. Trust us! God is always there, waiting to hear from you and wanting you to know of his unconditional love for you. Recall the words of Pope John Paul II of beloved memory, "Never forget that Jesus in the tabernacle wants you to be at his side, so that he can fill your hearts with the experience of his friendship, which alone gives meaning and fulfillment to your lives" (Apostolic Letter *Mane Nobiscum Domine*, no. 30).
