- 6) Is there a special ministry to Catholics in jail or prisons? YES.
 - a) If a deaf person OR the family member of a deaf family is in prison, I, Fr. Mike, our Deacons are very willing to visit that person. However, if the person is in a state or federal prison, the prisoner has to put our name on the prisoner's "Visitor List". See me (Fr. Joe) and I can explain how to do this.
 - b) If a person is in COOK COUNTY JAIL, there is a special ministry, KOLBE HOUSE, from the Archdiocese of Chicago. Kolbe House does a very good job ministering to prisoners.
 - c) The PNCEA is a national Catholic organization. The PNCEA has a wonderful newsletter, "Let's Talk!" (Spanish is "Hablemos!"). PNCEA will send this newsletter to someone who is in prison OR to a prisoner's family, FREE! If you want more info, www.pncea.org.
