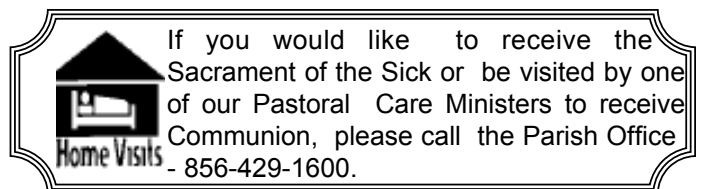

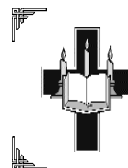

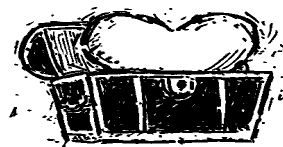


COUNCIL OF CHURCHES SPRING MEETING

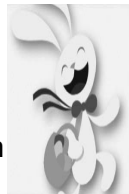
SPIRITUALITY CONVOCATION

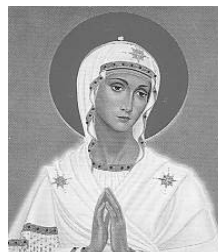

to develop the inner freedom to resist the temptation constantly to seek more.

Only in this way will the nation avoid what Paul VI called "the most evident form of moral underdevelopment," namely greed.□
