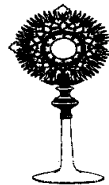

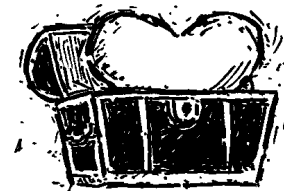
Also through the generosity of the Knights of Columbus, all the proceeds from the breakfasts are contributed to Christ The King Parish.
