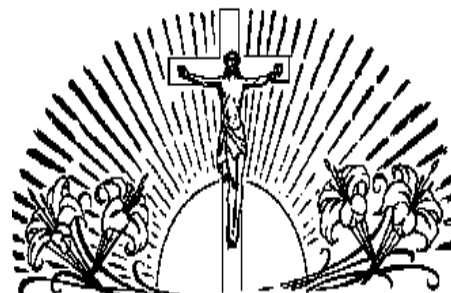

During this year dedicated to the great Apostle and Evangelist, St. Paul, we are reminded in 2 Corinthians of his absolute conviction that the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead changes everything we know. According to St. Paul, the Resurrection of Christ brings a new creativity, vitality and a confident hope for the future. St. Paul at one time persecuted the nascent Church but on the way to Damascus he was visited by the Risen Lord Jesus Christ.

St. Paul's encounter with the Risen Christ transformed his life as he surrendered his old ways and spent his life announcing this Good News. May you and your family have a blessed Easter and may you be filled with the joy of God's victory over sin and death!

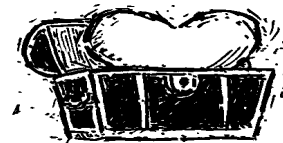

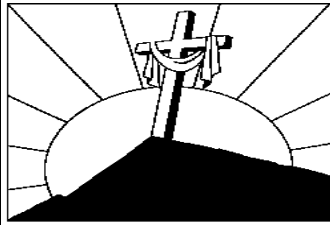

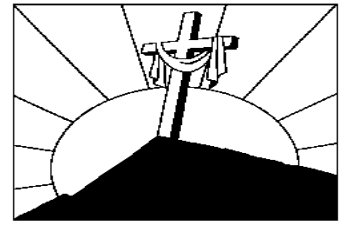
STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION
