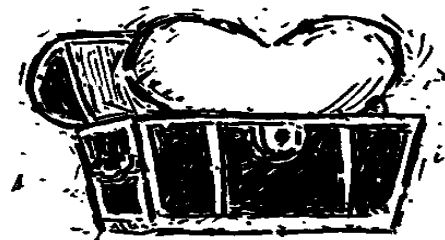

Family Nights are Tuesday and Wednesday from 7:00-10:00PM - unlimited rides - \$20 per person. Come join the fun!

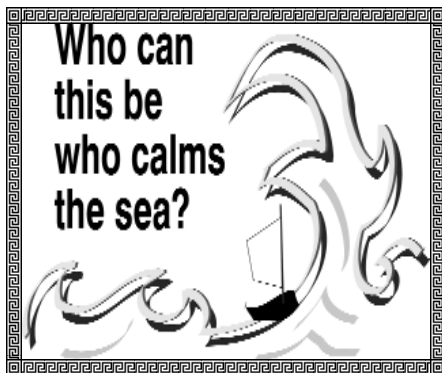

## A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

*“They woke Him and said to Him, ‘Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?’ He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, ‘Quiet! Be still!’ The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then He asked them, ‘Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?’ They were filled with great awe and said to one another, ‘Who is this whom even the wind and sea obey?’”*

Isn't it easy to picture the scene and listen to the conversation. The Lord goes along for the ride and uses the moment to invite the disciples to a deeper faith. We can hear the wind, get dampened by the waves and become frightened by the many challenges which surround us. Meanwhile we see Jesus comfortably asleep on his cushion.

The fear filled question ‘do you not care that we are perishing?’ We know the answer and the resulting quieting of the sea. Does He not care? Why did Jesus come in the first place? He came to offer forgiveness, to calm our fears and anxieties, and with Him to journey to the Father. ‘Do you not yet have faith?’

When we pray, we begin by seeking the calming presence of our God. The psalmist tells us, ‘Be still and know that I am God.’ We are asked to put aside our fears and anxieties and replace them with hope, allowing His peaceful presence to touch our lives. Besides the question which concludes this passage, I wonder how the disciples related their experience to others when they reached the shore. I wonder how we share our prayer experiences with others.

### **First Reading: Job 38: 1, 8-11**

Job, in his suffering, questioned the power of God. The Lord proclaims his power and indicates that even the sea is subject to his will.

### **Second Reading: II Corinthians 5: 14-17**

Christ died for all of us that we may live for him. Anyone who believes in Christ enters into new and eternal life.

### **Gospel: Mark 4: 35-40**

During a bad storm, Jesus ordered the wind and sea to be still, and his disciples were quite amazed at his power. Jesus reminds them to trust and have faith, even in times of danger.
