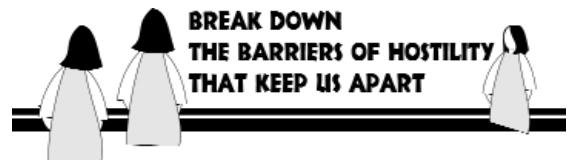

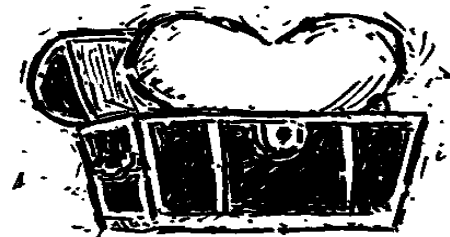

WORD OF LIFE

In the present situation of our nation, a serious question has arisen about the moral obligation of Catholics to work for the overturning of the Supreme Court decisions in Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton. There are those who would tell us that such work is futile and, therefore, to be abandoned, so that we can devote ourselves to help prevent individuals from choosing abortion. As Catholics, we can never cease to work for the correction of gravely unjust laws. Law is the fundamental expression of our culture and implicitly teaches citizens what is morally acceptable. Our efforts to assist those who are tempted to do what is always and everywhere wrong or are suffering from the effects of having committed a gravely immoral act ... ultimately make little sense, if we remain idle regarding unjust laws and decisions of courts regarding the same intrinsic evils. We are never justified in abandoning the work of changing legislation and of reversing decisions of the courts which are anti-life and anti-family.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS **HIS WORD TODAY** by Rev. William J. Reilly

16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught. He said to them. ‘Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.’ People were coming and going in great numbers and had no opportunity even to eat... He came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near, for through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father.”

A wonderful scene is created when children excitedly try to tell others of an exciting event, a game, a day at the beach, the circus. As they try to get words to portray their experience, the listeners are filled with joy knowing how satisfied they were.

St. Mark does the same thing with his pen as he describes the apostles summarizing their experience as His first evangelists. He listens attentively, smiles, perhaps asks a few lead questions, offers an encouraging word, while allowing them to absorb and appreciate what they have done. His calling them aside is to prepare them for what will follow.

I can use this passage and see myself in the presence of Jesus, telling Him of the great things which have happened in my life because of Him. The gift of my family and friends, the blessings received or the support given me, can be spoken of with great enthusiasm. He might ask me to rest a while, to think about other gifts received or tasks to be done. He might want to tell me that He has greater things in store for tomorrow.

I might use the words of St. Paul and his message of peace to examine where I may be the instrument of Christ’s peace for others. I might look at the injustices which exist around me and our world, and see where I can use my gifts to bring about peace and justice. When I work as His instrument I am no different from the apostles who spent time with Him in the deserted place to reflect upon what He wants me to do.

First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6 In this passage, God denounces false leaders who have scattered his people. He promises that they will be reunited and led by one who is just and wise.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18 Paul explains that through Jesus Christ, there is no longer hostility between Gentile and Jew. Instead, through the Spirit of Christ, both groups become one body and are equal in the eyes of God.

Gospel: Mark 6:30-34 The apostles returned after their first mission and told Jesus what they had done and taught. He told them to rest, but the people kept coming to them. So they went to find a private place, but the people learned where they were going and arrived first. Jesus felt sorry for them and decided to teach them instead of resting.
