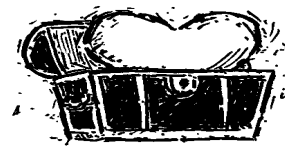

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

For over thirty years, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated **Respect Life Sunday** on the first Sunday in October. The theme this year is *Hope and Trust in Life!*

The message of hope has been a consistent theme of Pope Benedict XVI during this past year. In his second encyclical, *In Hope We Are Saved (Spe Salvi)*, the Holy Father teaches us that God is the foundation of hope: not any god, but the God who has a human face and who has loved us to the end, each one of us and humanity in its entirety.□

The theme of his April visit to our country was *Christ Our Hope*. The Holy Father said those three words express the Church's belief that Christ is the face of God in human history and gives fullness to people's lives.


It is fitting, therefore, that we should celebrate *Respect Life Sunday 2008* in that spirit of hope and in the love of Jesus that heals and transforms our world. It is only in His love that we can build a culture where every one can hope and trust in life.

Since there is an unbreakable bond between the love of our God who has a human face and the love our neighbor, we are compelled to oppose violence against persons in any form, whether it is through abortion, abuse, the death penalty or war. In our work to end abortion, we must love equally the unborn child and the mothers who carry them. The sick and the dying must be afforded proper medical care and protected from those who would seek to end their lives prematurely through euthanasia.

Our call to love compels us to also continue to work against embryonic stem cell research that destroys innocent human life and to promote umbilical cord and adult stem cell research. Our defense of life must also include working to eliminate racism, poverty and hunger. These are affronts to God Himself.

To do this we need your support. As you know, the Respect Life Collection is the primary source of funding for our Respect Life activities and initiatives. Your support will help us meet the challenge of building a Culture of Life in our time by moving the wider culture to respect the lives and dignity of all persons through education and service. I ask you once again to generously support this collection.
