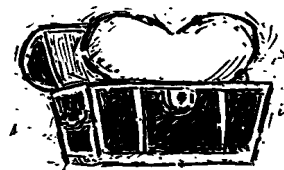

**MEN'S CONFERENCE**

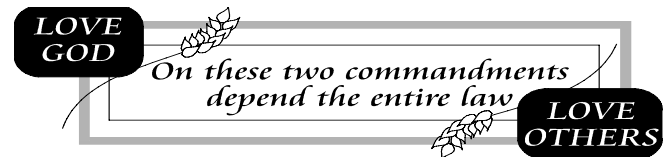
