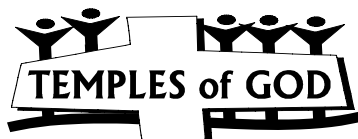

Dear Parishioner,

I'm sure you have seen in the bulletin the bar chart that gives an overview of our financial situation on a quarterly basis. This has been a good and a bad year for finances here at Christ the King Parish for the fiscal year 2007-2008. We received a very generous unrestricted donation in the form of a bequest in the amount of \$346,000.00. Of course this amount added to our ordinary income and Christmas and Easter collections for this year actually masks what was a rather lean year for us.

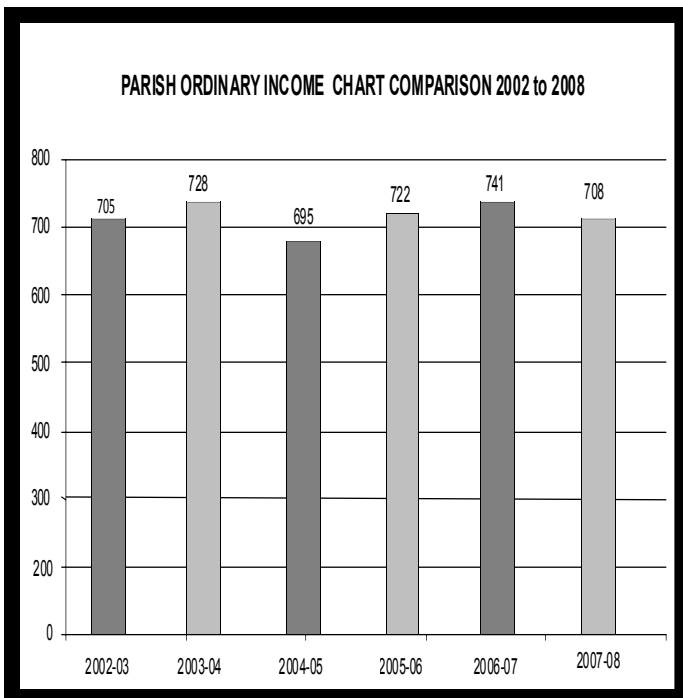
As you recall, we initiated an increased giving campaign about two years ago that paid for the campaign and realized a slight increase in our ordinary income. This increase did not last long and over time we returned basically to where we had been before the campaign. What has been steadily decreasing over the past few years is the amount collected for Christmas and Easter, and this affects our bottom line. Just this past year we have had some 50 funerals here at the parish, many of those who passed were generous givers and with the difficult economy of late, we have witnessed a slight cutting back from some in church donations. On top of all this, in an attempt to respond to the diocesan vision of dynamic and vibrant parishes, we have hired full/part time ministers in the fields of youth outreach, music, liturgy, administration, RCIA, adult education and spirituality. Therefore, with salaries, benefits, car allowance for the religious sisters and increased fixed cost, we did not realize a balanced budget for the year 2007-2008.

At the same time, I want you to know that we have made significant cuts in spending in the fields of religious education, rectory, custodial and capital expenses. We have discussed with the finance council ways to both cut spending and increase revenue. A more realistic projection of what our ordinary income will be for the next fiscal year and a plan, with the help and advice of our finance council as how to increase giving, will help to achieve reaching a balanced budget. A balanced budget that affords us beautiful liturgies, greater ministerial outreach and a parish community aware of it's many talents, gifts and strengths in creating a more vibrant and dynamic experience of God in our lives!

I thank you all for your generosity of time, talent and treasure. I appeal to you to help build up our parish by full, active and dedicated participation. We soon will embark on a new process of revitalizing parish life by discovering our talents, maximizing our gifts and living our strengths, in a way that accentuates the positive and builds a dynamic community of faith, alive with the love of Jesus. Stay tuned and join the moving of the Spirit among us.

May the Lord continue to bless us with gifts of unity, peace and joy!
