CONGRATULATIONS ~ SISTER JULIE KANE

Profiled as one of the North Shore 100 people who are making a difference for local residents.

Even though she may be "retired" from parish outreach and adult education at St. Mary Star of the Sea, she's still reaching out to people.

Sister Julie Kane is the type of person who serves suppers to the needy in Beverly on Friday night and wakes up early to wave her multicolored peace flag at a vigil the next morning.

She brings Holy Communion to shut-ins and nursing home residents several times a week and routinely baby-sits for her grandniece and grandnephews, who happen to be 11 year old quadruplets with lots for energy.

Did we mention she's 80 years old? "She is a dynamo".

She also heads the Pax Christi group which is Latin for Peace of Christ, an international Catholic organization that works to promote peace all over the world. Kane helps the 15 core members of the Beverly chapter to think globally and act locally. They organize soup supper in Beverly to raise money for Oxfam America and hold concerts for the House of Peace in Ipswich, a home for refugees. They've planted a Japanese maple tree in downtown Beverly to honor the victims of Hiroshima and erected a peace pole on Beverly Common.

As a sister of Notre Dame, Kane says her mission is to work for peace and justice by reaching out to the neglected. As a girl who grew up in Beverly, she also has a deep connection to the community.

ROSARY FOR VOCATIONS JOYFUL MYSTERIES

The Annunciation ~ *The Angel Gabriel announces to Mary, a virgin, that she will become the Mother of God, Word made Flesh. For all centuries to come, Jesus will become flesh in the Holy Eucharist to nourish us in a most intimate union with Him.*

We pray for all priests and religious who daily, through the words of the consecration at Mass, and through Holy Communion, bring us the Body and Blood of Christ.

The Visitation ~ *Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth, who recognizes Mary as the living tabernacle/or their Divine Lord.*

We pray especially for priests and religious who bring Holy Communion to the sick, the shut-ins, and Viaticum to the dying.

The Nativity of Jesus ~ *Jesus is born in Bethlehem. The angels announce His birth; kings and shepherds come to adore Him.*

We pray especially for those who will be ordained and professed soon, that they may remain faithful all their lives to the sublime privilege of being "other Christs" among us.

The Presentation in the Temple ~ *Mary and Joseph, in obedience to the Law, bring Jesus to the temple to be dedicated to God. Simeon expresses his gratitude to God for revealing the Messiah to him before he dies.*

Jesus Dies on the Cross ~ *Jesus sheds His last drops of Precious Blood to redeem us from sin and death.*

The Resurrection ~ *Jesus arises from the dead and appears to the Apostles.*
