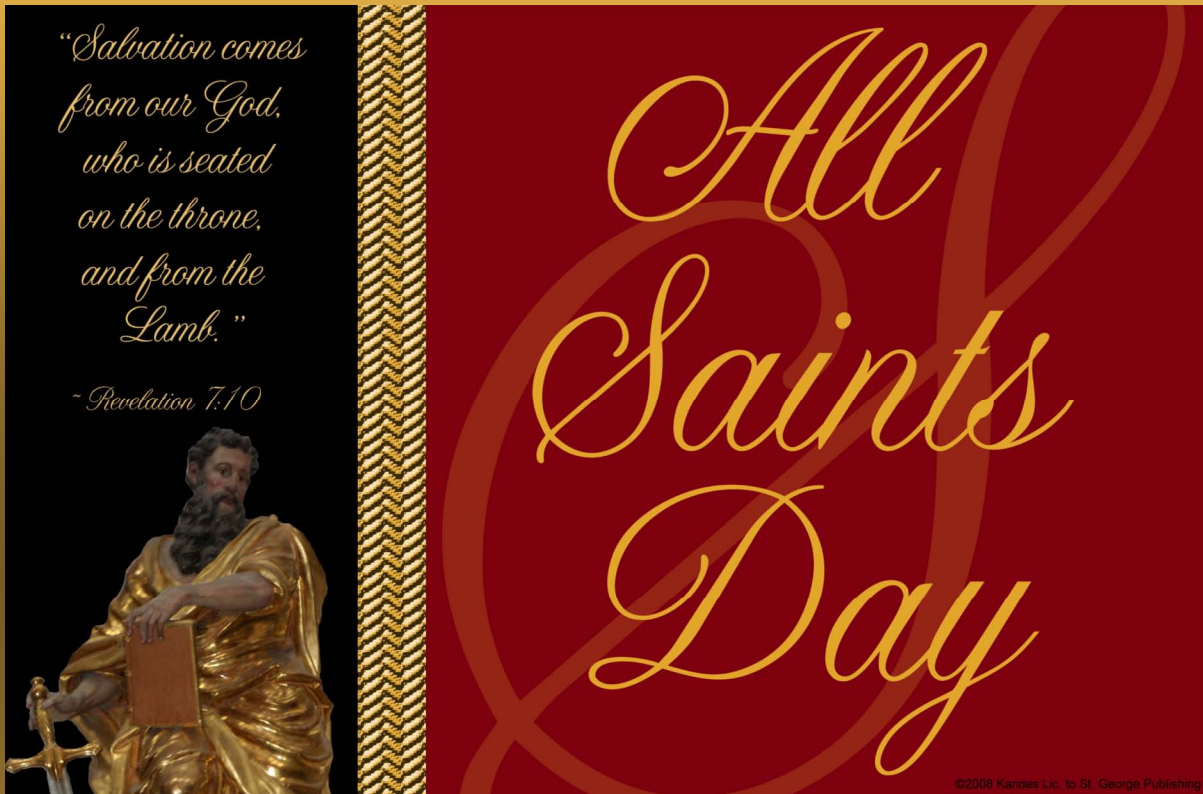

All Souls Day is November 2nd, the day after All Saints Day. It is a feast/solemnity observed by the Roman Catholic Church for the commemoration of the faithfully departed souls in Purgatory, while undergoing purification of their sins before coming into full union with God in Heaven.

All Souls' Day was established in the eleventh century by St. Odilo of Cluny. The Church of England abolished All Souls' Day during the Reformation. However, the day has been re-established in Anglo-Catholic churches.

All Souls' Day is also known as the Feast of All Souls, Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (from the Latin Commemoratio omnium Fidelium Defunctorum), Defuncts' Day (in Mexico and Belgium), or Day of the Dead (in Italy).

O God, the Creator and Redeemer of all the faithful,
grant to the souls of Thy servants and handmaids departed,
the remission of all their sins;
that through pious supplications they may obtain
the pardon they have always desired.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Because of concerns relating to the spread of the H1N1 Flu, the Archdiocese of Boston recently issued some norms relating to the celebration of the Mass. Below, I mention the norms that pertain to our parish and also some other helpful information. I ask that everybody please be attentive to the following points. I will also mention them at Mass this weekend.

- ◆ During Mass, until further notice, please refrain from shaking hands at the sign of peace. When the priest extends the invitation to “offer the sign of peace,” a bow to those around you suffices as a sign of peace.
- ◆ There are only two ways to receive communion.

On the tongue. If you receive on the tongue, please **stop** in front of the minister of Communion and tilt your head slightly backwards. Allow the minister to place the host on your tongue and do not keep moving forward towards the minister. Avoid closing your mouth until the minister has withdrawn his hand. Ministers of Communion must take great care that their fingers do not make contact with the tongues or lips of those receiving Communion. Those receiving Communion can help in this process by following the above instructions.

In the hand. If you receive Communion on the hand, there is only ONE proper way to do so. Your left hand should be placed over your right hand. The minister places the Host in your left hand. You step to the side, take the host out of your left hand with your right hand, and place the host immediately in your mouth. Please have your hand open. You do not receive the Host with your fingers. It is placed on your palm. Again, ministers of Communion ought to be careful not to touch the hands of those to whom they are distributing Communion.

- ◆ **If you are sick, please do not come to Mass.** Occasionally I have heard people say, “Father, I had the worst flu, but I got to Mass.” While I admire your dedication to the Mass (and those who too easily excuse themselves from Mass could learn something by your example), you should not come to Mass if you are contagious. By doing so, you place other people in danger of getting sick. The most charitable thing you can do is to care for your fellow parishioners by not placing them at risk.
- ◆ Please consider using hand sanitizer as you enter the church.

While I understand that this is not the most “spiritual” of bulletin columns, it is important for our life as a community. Our attentiveness to these guidelines is a way of loving our neighbor.
