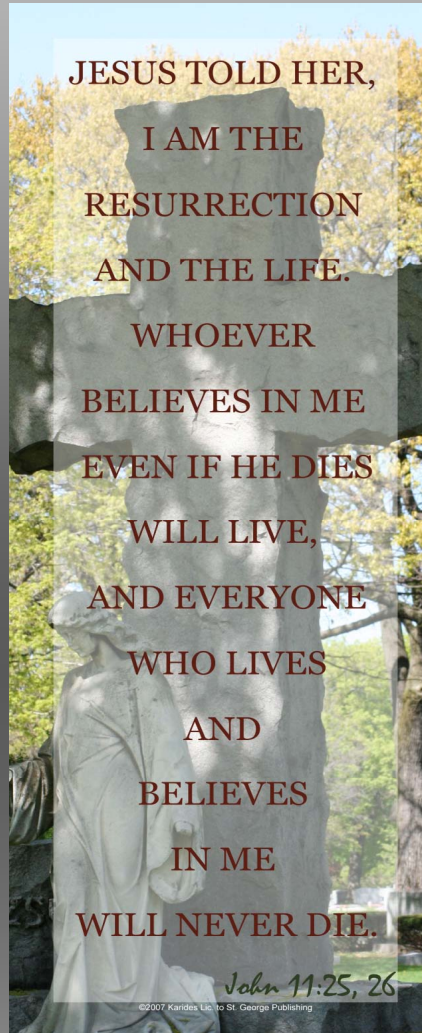

SPOTLIGHT ON GRADE 6 - SMS sixth graders had a great time at Nature's Classroom in Groton, MA, where they enjoyed a plethora of activities ranging from night walks to dissections. In science, they are investigating the diversity of the 5 Kingdoms and have learned Linnaeus' 7 levels of classification. In the lab, they looked at and sketched samples from fresh water sources. In Math, bar graphing and making plots and tables to summarize data is being explored. In Language Arts, the 6th grade has been concentrating on creating character analyses using the computer lab. In Geography, Grade 6 recently completed a project where they had to map over 60 major features and write a 5-paragraph story as if they were explorers, complete with a Power Point presentation.
