4. In **Exodus 3:1-4:17**, God spoke to Moses from out of a burning bush. Retell that conversation in your own words.
5. What finally convinced Moses to accept this "call", or assignment, from God?

6. Scan the paragraph headings in **Exodus 7:14-10:29** and tell what happened.
  
7. What was the tenth, or "final" plague, in **Exodus 11-12**? How were the Israelites protected from this plague?
  
8. According to **Exodus 13:17-14:31**, what happened after the Israelites left Egypt?
  
9. Read **Exodus 15**. How did the Israelites respond to being saved in this way?
  
10. Moses accepted God's "call" or assignment, even though he was reluctant at first. He thought he was not adequate to the task, and didn't realize that God would be with him all the way. Have you ever found yourself in this kind of situation, where you have to rely entirely on God to get you through? Can you think of any other examples of leaders today, who might really need to rely on God's help to deal with their challenges?
