3. Read **2 Samuel 12:1-6**. In Nathan's story about the rich man who had many sheep, who was: The rich man?

4. How did David react to this story? What did he think the consequences should be for the rich man?
5. Read **2 Samuel 12:7-13**. Nathan was brutally honest with David and called him on his sin. How did David respond to Nathan's honesty?

6. How did God respond to David?

7. David is one of the heroes of the faith, but today we have learned from the Bible that he was not a super-human saint. What does this say about the power of God's grace?

8. The prophet Nathan pointed out the injustice of David's actions. Name acts of injustice you see in your school, in your community, and in the world. What are we to do when we see injustices?
